Cancer Council Queensland's accommodation lodges offer a potential **100,000** bed nights statewide each year.



3786 calls to **13 11 20** answered for cancer support and information.



491 people referred to our Cancer Counselling Service.



\$44,000 of financial assistance provided through Cancer Council services, **supporting 183 patients**.



634 wigs and turbans were provided to local cancer patients.
