SUPPORTING PEOPLE AFFECTED BY CANCER

CCQ offers a wide range of cancer support services to assist patients and their families. In 2016, we provided hundreds of people in the **Wide Bay Burnett region** with support.

Cancer Council Queensland's accommodation lodges offer a potential **100,000** bed nights statewide each year.

 **543** calls to **13 11 20** answered for cancer support and information.



35 people referred to our Cancer Counselling Service.



\$13,615 of financial assistance provided through Cancer Council services, **supporting 61 patients**.



202 wigs and turbans were provided to local cancer patients.
