Cancer Council Queensland (CCQ) supports the ongoing professional development of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health professionals working with people affected by cancer. The two-day program will support Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Workers in providing cancer care, prevention, screening and early detection, and end of life care. When returning to the workplace, it is expected that health professionals will use their learning experiences to contribute to improved cancer outcomes across Queensland.

Participants need to register for the program and bursary funding is available for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people working as health professionals to learn about cancer care, end of life, cancer screening and prevention. Financial Assistance (Bursary) Application

The Cancer Council Queensland Bursary is for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people living and working as health professionals in Queensland.

Cancer Council Queensland will provide a one-off bursary valued **up to \$700 AUD** (including GST) to successful applicants. Participants who are successful in obtaining the bursary are encouraged to reduce costs wherever possible by carpooling with other participants, or staying with friends or family or at Cancer Council Queensland lodges if available. The bursary is a contribution to the cost of attending the course and may not cover all expenses to attend. The bursary will be paid via Electronic Funds Transfer.

We understand that costs may change slightly between when you apply for the bursary and when you make bookings. The final amount of the bursary will be determined based on the needs outlined in your application as well as a discussion between Cancer Council Queensland and the participant. **Please outline the estimated costs for reimbursement based on the costs at the time of completing this application.** Participants are advised to keep their receipts and to provide them to Cancer Council Queensland if requested to do so. If participants are unable to attend the course, or if costs to attend change, applicants will be asked to repay funds to Cancer Council Queensland (in full or the difference in amount).

Selection Details

Bursary applications must

- Register for the Caring for Our Community Course in Mt Isa on 20 + 21 March, 2018
- Identify as Aboriginal and or Torres Strait Islander
- Be a health worker living and working in Queensland at the time of the course
- Be able to provide information to networks within their communities after the course
- Live more than 50km from the course location and require financial assistance to be able to attend the course
- Please contact communitysupportservices@cancerqld.org.au if you do not meet the criteria and need assistance to attend the course

Selection Process

Once received, the applications will be reviewed for completeness. The CCQ Bursary Selection Committee will meet weekly to evaluate the submitted applications and may call for additional information in order to reach a final decision. Each applicant will be notified via email of the outcome. Applications will be assessed within 7 working days of receiving the application.
