Supporting people affected by cancer

No one should go through cancer alone.

CCQ offers a wide range of cancer support services to assist patients and their families. In 2019, we provided thousands of people in the Far North Queensland region with support.



5621 nights of accommodation were provided in our Marylyn Mayo Lodge in Cairns.



480 contacts were made with 13 11 20, providing support to those impacted by cancer.



43 people referred to our Cancer Counselling Service.



\$10,150 of financial assistance provided through Cancer Council services, supporting 46 patients.



115 wigs and turbans were provided to Queenslanders who experienced hair loss as a result of cancer treatment.



41,412 kilometers driven by volunteers in Home to Treatment vehicles.
